



California Transparency in Supply Chains Act

Vista Metals Georgia (VMG) believes in conducting business in a responsible, ethical, and legal manner and expects our suppliers to do the same. Although we believe our suppliers conduct business in the same manner we do, as a small manufacturer, we have not instituted a formal system to evaluate whether they follow all worldwide laws and regulations, including the California Transparency in Supply Chains Act.

In accordance with the requirements of the California Transparency Act, VMG discloses the following:

Verification: VMG does not engage in verification of product supply chains to evaluate and address the risks of human trafficking and slavery.

Audit: VMG does not conduct audits of suppliers to evaluate supplier compliance with company standards for trafficking and slavery in supply chains.

Certification: VMG does not require direct suppliers to certify that materials incorporated into the product comply with the laws regarding slavery and human trafficking of the country or countries in which they are doing business.

Internal Accountability: VMG does not maintain internal accountability standards and procedures for employees or contractors failing to meet company standards regarding slavery and human trafficking.

Training: VMG does not provide company employees and management, who have direct responsibility for supply chain management, training on human trafficking and slavery, particularly with respect to mitigating risks within the supply chains of products.
